A Message from the Leadership

Claire Garner - Director of Parenting Education

Every month BCAP's Home Visiting Programs, Healthy Families & Parents as Teachers host a Group Connection where parents in both programs meet and information is presented about relevant topics. Before the pandemic these meetings were held in person, in April 2021 we began holding virtual Group Connections. We are now hosting in-person and virtual meetings. In July we were at Smithville Park for a Family Fun Day with food, activities, and games. We recently hosted an information session about Gentle Parenting that parents had requested. In the fall, a puppeteer from the Burlington County Library performed a puppet show and the families made puppets. We recently had an in-person session informing the parents about fine motor skills and the families were able to experience activities involving those skills The children painted, colored, drew pictures and built with blocks.

During the pandemic, the Consumer Education Resource Specialist at the Child Care Resource & Referral office at Burlington Community Action Partnership (BCAP) developed a unique way of getting into the classrooms and bringing a smile to the children's masked faces. Chris Robles contacted child care providers and offered to come into the classroom virtually, calling it BCAP Book Club. Her offering was story time with the children and an activity the teacher can do with the kids following the session. This became very popular!

Since we have been able to have in-person visits with the providers, Chris now goes out to the facilities and does the BCAP Book Club in person. The children have a fun time, and the teachers get a break. Chris also includes follow-up activities that the teachers can do with the children. We receive messages and comments from the providers about how much they enjoy their time with Miss Chris!

Gina Adams - Deputy Director of Community and Support Services.

Ms. Hawkins is a life long resident of Burlington County. For many years she and her significant other shared a home. After his death she found it difficult to meet all of her household expenses on her own with a fixed income. Ms. Hawkins applied for several subsidized senior housing in the County, including BCAP. She was told that the wait list ranged between 2-5 years. She had no choice but to wait.

The owner of the house she was renting decided to sell it. The new owner raised the rent. She began to fall further and further behind in her rent and faced eviction. She had nowhere to go. In fall 2023, Ms. Hawkins contacted BCAP to see where her name was on the senior housing list and if she could get back rent assistance to stay in her home. She was advised that there were several applicants ahead of her on BCAP's senior housing waitlist. She completed an intake to assist her with back rent. It was determined that she was not eligible for back rent assistance because her income was not sufficient to pay the rent going forward. She went to court regarding her pending eviction. She was given an order that she had to leave her home. Later that same day, she received an email and voicemail from BCAP advising her that her name reached the top of the list after waiting about 18 months. Miss Hawkins reports "I am happy and relaxed. I sleep better knowing I have a roof over my head. I enjoy living in my new apartment. I am so relieved and thankful that BCAP came through for me"

History of BCAP

Burlington Community Action Partnership (BCAP) (formerly known as Burlington County Community Action Program) began operating in 1965. The organization was established to address the needs of low-income persons in Burlington County.

Nationally, at the time of the Agency's inception, Congress had declared its War on Poverty and signed the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964. It stated that everyone in America should have an opportunity to obtain an education, work, and live in decency and with dignity. As one of the most significant legislative documents of our time, it impacted positively upon the lives of America's poor and disadvantaged of all ages, races, colors, creeds, and ethnic backgrounds. It provided for the creation of Community Action Agencies throughout the nation to work toward the elimination of poverty.

Locally, in response to the critical human needs of the poor, a small group of individuals began meeting in each other's homes and in area churches to develop strategies for eliminating poverty and removing the barriers to selfsufficiency. With dedication to the mission and a common vision, those unsung heroes carved out the framework for a community-based organization of people helping people to help themselves.

Now one of the oldest of twenty-three community action agencies operating in New Jersey, Burlington Community Action Partnership is led by a tripartite Board of Trustees consisting of one-third representation from community stakeholders, one-third from public officials, and one-third from low-income residents.

The number and scope of activities administered by BCAP has grown steadily over the years. The Agency has moved from a small grassroots direct services program to one that operates projects having long-term effect on the community and totaling more than \$10 million annually. Program funds are used to support Housing and Energy, Community Services, Education and Health; and are reflective of the Agency's commitment to serving low-income persons in Burlington County.

OUR MISSION

The Burlington Community Action Partnership exists to combat the causes and reduce the effects of poverty in Burlington County. It fulfills the purpose by:

- Facilitating a community-based capacity for the human needs planning process, which focuses program strategies on promoting self-sufficiency among low-income people.
- Removing barriers to self-sufficiency among lowincome people in the organization and operation of institutions and programs.
- Maximizing participation of low-income people in the development and implementation of programs and projects and in the decision-making process of institutions affecting their lives.
- Testing new approaches to solving basic causes of poverty provided that they do not involve BCAP as a long-term, direct service provider.
- Supporting self-help groups and other cooperative efforts among low-income people.
- Working to better organize services related to the needs of the poor.
- Broadening resource base of programs directed to the elimination of poverty.
- Providing safe, decent, affordable housing to lowand moderate-income families.
- Providing housing counseling services.
